We hope in the Spirit to lead this discernment, renew the Church and heal our world.





We engage Catholics in the active discernment of our Church about women and the diaconate.














In the Letter to the Romans, St. Paul commends Phoebe to the church in Rome, introduces her as a deacon (diakonos) of the church at Cenchreae, and asks that they "receive her in the Lord" (Romans 16:1-2a).

Phoebe was a woman of great courage and deep love. She answered God's call to minister to God's people during the earliest days of the Church, when persecution against Christians was strong. She earned the trust of Paul, who depended on her to handle communications with the ecclesial community in Rome.



Ordaining women to the diaconate would bring a certain consistency to the Church's practice. We're not doing something that's completely extraordinary or new...this change would be grounded in the sources of our faith, found in the early church, situated in the context of the role women have in society today.... It means this is possible."
